Licensing:

All cats and dogs must be licensed and vaccinated against rabies by four months of age. Annual licenses can be obtained at the Humane Society of the Pikes Peak Region or at numerous veterinarian offices in the area.

Animal Control:

El Paso County and the cities of Fountain, Monument and Colorado Springs contract with the Humane Society to enforce animal control and licensing ordinances. Manitou Springs, Green Mountain Falls and the military bases enforce their own control but will bring strays to the Humane Society.

Leash law requires all dogs to be on a leash or under voice control at all times when off the owner's property. Horses may be kept inside the city limits in some areas depending on zoning and restrictive covenants. Certain animals are prohibited in some areas; unusual animals require a permit.
